- Hitting or Pushing: Physical harm is never allowed. Keep your hands to yourself or on your art!

If There's a Problem

- 1. Talking It Out: First try to solve problems by talking, listening and understanding each other.
- 2. Taking a Break: If needed, a short break can calm things down.
- 3. Parent/Guardian Involvement: If things don't get better, we'll talk to parents immediately to find the best way to help solve the problem.
- 4. In Extreme Cases: Such as bullying, fighting or other disruptive behavior, we will notify the Parent/Guardian that the camper not attend the remainder of the camp session.
