Message to Our Patrons and Visitors in Response to Coronavirus Sunday, March 8, 2020

Dear Friends of Glen Echo Park,

The Glen Echo Park Partnership for Arts and Culture values the health and safety of the Glen Echo Park community and takes the Coronavirus outbreak seriously. We realize many people have concerns, and we want to assure you that we are taking **proactive measures to ensure the cleanliness of our facilities**, including:

- Cleaning and disinfecting public spaces, including building lobbies, public restrooms, door handles and stair railings
- Providing hand sanitizer in public and common areas such as public restrooms, Spanish Ballroom lobby and promenade, GEPPAC office, Arcade classrooms and the Hall of Mirrors.
- Providing disinfectant wipes in all of our classroom spaces so that all instructors and students can wipe down commonly touched surfaces (door handles, sink faucets, light fixtures, chairs and tables) before and after each class.

We ask that if you do not feel well, please do not attend classes or events. The CDC recommends that individuals remain home for at least 24 hours after you no longer have a fever or signs of a fever.

Additionally, we ask that you take precautions, such as washing your hands thoroughly, not touching your face, and sneezing or coughing into your elbow or into a tissue and discarding tissues immediately.

The safety of our patrons and visitors is our top priority, and we are working with our major partners -- Montgomery County and the National Park Service -- to monitor the situation.
