This exhibition brings together a dynamic collection of ceramic sculptures -- both recent works and works from his past -- by sculptor Robert Devers. The exhibition is centered around a large floor installation titled "Low Tide." "Low Tide" is composed of various objects, both found and made by the hand of the artist, that present a collective source of inspiration for Devers.- The piece serves as the locus of memory for the recurring themes found in Devers' work.
