Although Corning passed in 2011, her vision continues to inspire. The course is currently led by Carol A. Jason, and this exhibition features her work, along with work by Holly Stone, Larry Kamlot, Tom Gannon, Judith A. Baldinger, and Nina Graybill. "Why abstracts?" asks Jason. Because abstracts "allow the artist to go straight to the subconscious and paint from an emotional place."
